<u>Front Door Access</u>: 24/7 keypad entry – 4 digit code will be made available to you within 24 hours of your stay.


Unlocking: Enter the 4 digit code. Rotate the thumb turn and unlock the deadbolt. From the inside, you can set the thumb turn to the vertical position to keep the door unlocked.

Locking: From the outside, press the Schlage button once and rotate the thumb turn to lock the deadbolt. From the inside, set the thumbturn to horizontal. The door will automatically lock from the outside.



House Rules

- ✓ The swimming pool is ready to use. If you choose to use it, please make sure you and your guests understand all the pool rules before use.
- ✓ The house uses a septic system that is sensitive.

 Please flush only toilet paper down the toilet and do not discard grease down the kitchen drain.
- ✓ Please be courteous to the neighbors next door and observe the quiet hours starting at 10 PM every night when you are out on the patio, backyard, or driveway.
- ✓ Please be sure to remove all garbage from the fridge and the home and place it in the garbage bin at the end of the driveway. This includes cleaning the grill, fire pit, and fireplaces. Garbage days are Fridays.
- Checkout is at 11 AM. The housekeeper will arrive at 11 to begin preparing the home for the next guests. Please respect the checkout time as to not interfere with the housekeeping team and cause any inconvenience to the next guests.
- Please be sure to turn all the thermostats to 60 degrees F.

Fire Safety



To use the indoor fireplace (lower level):

- 1) Make sure Flue is open! Twist lever at top of chimney opening.
- 2) We recommend using a duraflame log and 1 or 2 wood logs. Please purchase as there is no available firewood on our property.
- 3) Light fire and close screen. You must attend an open fire at all times.
- 4) Make sure fire is COMPLETELY out before closing flue. Make sure there are no embers burning.
- 5) Wait until ashes are cold (usually overnight), remove ash, and dispose along with your other refuse.



The hotel sat on top of the beautiful Neversink Mountain and offered some of the most beautiful views of the city. The pavilion that sat at the end of the property, known to locals as the "Witches Hat," still stands today and holds a special place in the heart of local residents.



The Daniel Boone Homestead, the site of the legendary pioneer's birth in 1734, offers a unique glimpse at the diverse and dynamic community that formed in the Oley Valley during the colonial period through exhibits, programs, and tours. Administered by the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission, the site includes 579 acres of land, the Boone House, six other eighteenth-century structures, a lake, picnic areas, and recreational facilities.

William Penn Memorial Fire Tower

This imposing stone and reinforced concrete tower is 120 feet tall and sits atop Mt. Penn, overlooking the City of Reading and its surroundings. The tower is Fire Tower under construction situated in a park setting on Skyline Drive, one mile from Reading's landmark Pagoda. From the top of the tower there is a 60 mile panoramic view . The top of the tower is 983 feet above 5th and Penn Street, the center of the city, and 1,046 feet above the Schuylkill River, and 1239 feet above sea level.

Der Distelfink Statue

1102 Red Bridge Rd, Reading, PA 19605



The Distelfink is the stylized bird that appears frequently on Deitsch (Pennsylvania Dutch or Pennsylvania German) art. Inspirations for the bird are the goldfinch or the painted bunting. Distelfinks appear in hex signs (also called barn stars), Himmelsbriefs, birth certificates, and many other manuscripts. They are also sacred in the Urglaawe religion. The Distelfink represents fortune, luck, and the soul of the Deitsch people. The statue at Grings Mill is an excellent physical representation of the artistic styling.



What Happened at Valley Forge

Valley Forge is the location of the 1777-1778 winter encampment of the Continental Army under General George Washington. Here the Continental Army, a collection of disparate colonial militias supported by hundreds of camp followers and allies, emerged under Washington's leadership as a cohesive and disciplined fighting force. In late 1777 while the British occupied the patriot capital of Philadelphia, Washington decided to have his troops winter at Valley Forge, a day's march from the city. Valley Forge was a naturally defensible plateau where they could train and recoup from the year's battles while winter weather, impassable roads, and scant supplies stopped the fighting.





Monocacy Hill Recreation Area is a 428 acre forest located in Amity Township, Douglassville, PA. This recreation area was purchased by Amity Township in 1967 for open space and recreation purposes. It features about 6 miles of forest trails and is open year round from dawn to dusk for a variety of activities. Park rules and trail maps are available at the park entrance on Geiger Road.

Green Lane Reservoir 1051 Walt Rd, Pennsburg, PA 18073

Length: 2.5 mile Elevation Gain: 150 ft

Green Lane Park Trail is a 12.5 mile heavily trafficked loop trail located near Green Lane, Pennsylvania that features a lake and is rated as moderate. The trail offers a number of activity options and is accessible year-round. Dogs are also able to use this trail but must be kept on leash.



Perkiomen Trail

Length: 20.6 miles

The Perkiomen Trail provides so many interesting historical and natural sites along its 20.6-mile length that visitors may have to ignore some of the trailside distractions to reach the other end.



Sprogel's Run

Length: 1.6mi Elevation Gain: 121ft

Sprogel's Run Trail: Prout Farm Park to Althouse Arboretum is a 1.6 mile lightly trafficked out and back trail located near Pottstown, Pennsylvania that features a river and is good for all skill levels. The trail is primarily used for hiking, walking, and nature trips and is accessible year-round.
